


Understanding God As He Is...

The Seriousness of Sin: Nadab and Abihu


Leviticus 10:2–3 (CSB) – 2 Then fire came from the LORD and consumed them, and they died before the LORD. 3 Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD has spoken: I will demonstrate my holiness to those who are near me, and I will reveal my glory before all the people." And Aaron remained silent.





The Seriousness of Sin: Uzzah & the Ark

1 Chronicles **13:9–10** (CSB) — 9 When they came to Chidon's threshing floor, Uzzah reached out to hold the ark because the oxen had stumbled. 10 Then the LORD's anger burned against Uzzah, and he struck him dead because he had reached out to the ark. So he died there in the presence of God.



The Seriousness of Sin: Ananias and Sapphira

Acts 5:10–11 (CSB) — **10** Instantly she dropped déad at his feet. When the young men came in, they found her dead, carried her out, and buried her beside her husband. 11 Then great fear came on the whole church and on all who heard these things.

 Isaiah 6:3 (CSB) — 3 And one called to another: Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of Armies; his glory fills the whole earth. 0

 Revelation 4:8 (CSB) — 8 Each of the four living creatures had six wings; they were covered with eyes around and inside. Day and night they never stop, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God, the Almighty, who was, who is, and who is to come.



Matthew 13:40–42 (CSB) — 40 Therefore, just as the weeds are gathered and burned in the fire, so it will be at the end of the age. 41 The Son of Man will send out his angels, and they will gather from his kingdom all who cause sin and those guilty of lawlessness. 42 They will throw them into the blazing furnace where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Luke 16:23–24 (CSB) — 23 And being in torment in Hades, he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off, with Lazarus at his side. 24 'Father Abraham!' he called out, 'Have mercy on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this flame!'


Revelation 20:14–15 (CSB) — 14 Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is **the second death**, the lake of fire. **15** And anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was **thrown into the lake of fire.**

Romans 3:25–26 (CSB) — 25 God presented him as the mercy seat by his blood, through faith, to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his restraint God passed over the sins previously committed. **26** God presented him to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so that he would be **just and justify** the one who has faith in Jesus.
